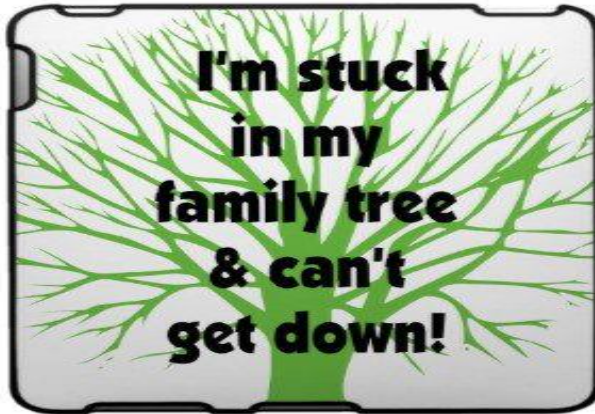

October 2016 is significant because this is when we as a nation remember those fallen in the Battle of the Somme. In my family tree alone I have 3 young men: Samuel William NOSTER, Charles Leslie HUTCHINSON, William John WILLIAMS, all cut down during this time. Their names are inscribed on the Memorial Walls at Caterpillar Cemetery together – no bodies found. There are many other names - 1,2,3,4 members of the same family who did not return. The names on many cenotaphs in NZ reflect to painful cost. There are many who did come back to NZ and tried to move on from the horror of war. NZ Archives staff have been working hard to ensure the Army records of all who enlisted are available.

Check out PARLIAMENTARY PAPERS – e.g. *The Appendix to the Journals of the House of Representatives* (AJHR), sometimes known as "the A to Js", is a collection of government-related reports published every year from 1858. The reports cover many subjects, documenting the work of government departments and a wide range of other activities carried out by, or of interest to, the government of the day.

GST or Not to GST – that is the question! Starting 1 October 2016, in accordance with New Zealand GST laws, Ancestry and (eventually) other non-resident companies are required to charge 15% GST on all electronic services provided to New Zealand based customers e.g. music, gaming, genealogy.... Accordingly subscription prices will be updated to reflect the addition of GST.

Those who are on a limited income may now think twice about which subscriptions and group memberships they will pay for. We may not be able to change the government's charges but there are other options available such as using your local library if they have the Library subscription or check out <http://www.genealogydiscount.co.uk/> gives discount codes for some of the major players. There may be other options out there too.

Scotland's People: Upgraded website

You can search indexes to records, including statutory records of births, deaths and marriages, **free of charge** for the first time. You will now only be charged when you view or download a record image. 😊😊😊😊😊😊😊😊

You can also now link to the Register of Corrected Entries from the relevant entry in a statutory register free of charge. Transcriptions of the 1881 census (1881 LDS) can now be read without charge. Indexes to births, marriages and death for 2015 and early 2016 have been added, and you can now search coats of arms up to 1916.

150,000+ baptism entries from Scottish Presbyterian churches other than the Old Parish Registers (OPRs) of the Church of Scotland have been added. . More of these records will be added in the near future, including marriages and burials. Over the next few months more types of records held by National Records of Scotland (NRS), including records of Kirk sessions and other church courts will be added.

WW1 Battle Timelines October/November 1916

Battles of the Western Front: Grinding Battles of Attrition in 1916 — the Somme

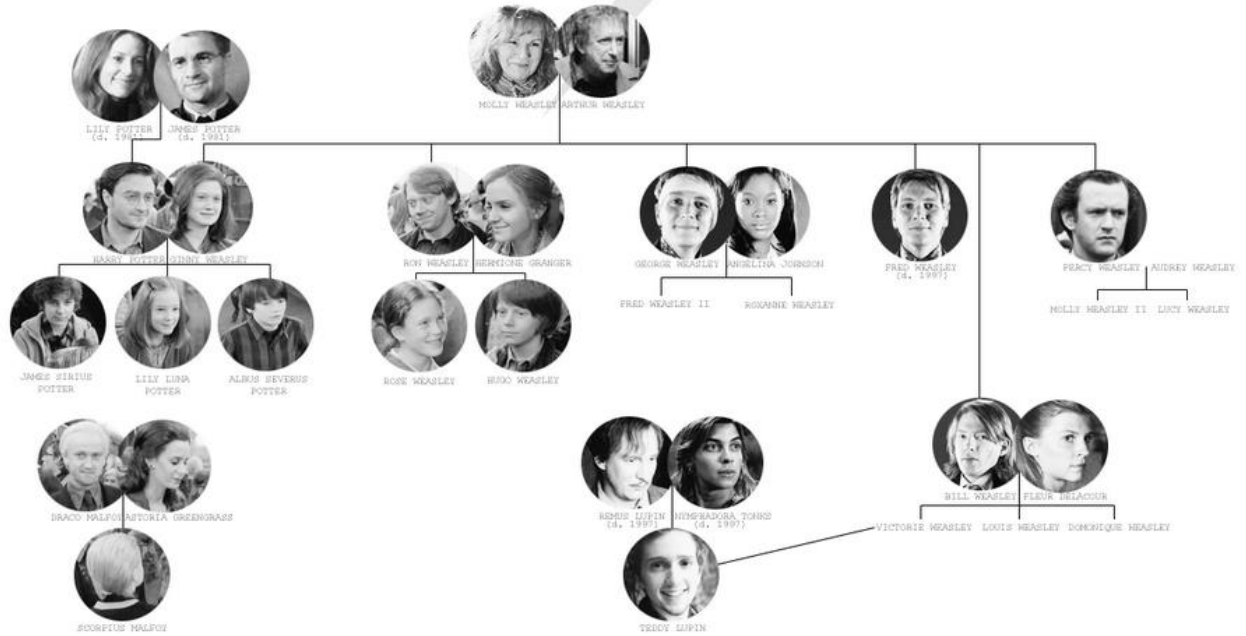
1st October	Battle of le Transloy (Somme): Battle of the Ancre Heights (Somme) begins: German airship " <i>L.-31</i> " destroyed by aeroplane at Potters Bar, near London.
8th October	German submarine " <i>U.-53</i> " captures and destroys five ships outside Newport, Rhode Island, U.S.A.
10th October	Entente Governments send ultimatum to Greek Government demanding surrender of the Greek fleet: New Greek Ministry formed.
11th October	Greek Government accepts Entente demands.
13th October	Norwegian Government issue orders prohibiting belligerent submarines from using Norwegian territorial waters.
18th October	Battle of the Transloy Ridges (Somme) ends.
20th October	Russian battleship " <i>Imperatritsa Mariya</i> " destroyed by internal explosion at Sevastopol: Anglo-French Conference held at Calais to discuss Greek participation in the war.
21st October	Austrian Premier murdered
24th October	"First Offensive Battle" of Verdun begins [French name and date.] Fort Douaumont recaptured by French forces.
26th October	First German destroyer raid in Dover Straits.
28th October	New Austrian Premier appointed: British hospital ship " <i>Galeka</i> " totally wrecked by mine off Havre.
30th October	New German Minister for War appointed.

NOVEMBER 1916

1st November	Fort Vaux (Verdun) recaptured by French forces.
5th November	Germany and Austria proclaim an "Independent State of Poland".

7th November	Mr. Wilson re-elected President of the United States.
11th November	Battle of the Ancre Heights (Somme) ends.
12th November	Shiraz (South Persia) occupied by British forces.
13th November	Battle of the Ancre begins: Beaumont-Hamel stormed by British forces.
15th November	British advance into Sinai begins: Inter-Allied Conference held in Paris to discuss: (a) the relations between Governments and Staffs; (b) policy and strategy; (c) Greece; (d) Poland.
18th November	Battle of the Ancre,ends: Battles of the Somme ends.
20th November	German Foreign Minister resigns
21st November	British hospital ship " <i>Britannic</i> " sunk by mine in Ægean Sea; Zimmermann appointed German Foreign Minister: Emperor Francis Joseph of Austria dies. .
23rd November	Greek Provisional Government at Salonika declare war on Germany and Bulgaria: British hospital ship " <i>Braemar Castle</i> " damaged and beached in Ægean Sea - probably mined.
24th November	Russian Premier and Foreign Minister, resigns
25th November	The German air force is established as a separate branch of the German army.
26th November	Second German naval raid on Lowestoft: French battleship " <i>Suffren</i> " sunk by submarine in the Bay of Biscay: German raider " <i>Moewe</i> " sails from Kiel on second cruise.
27th November	German airship raid on East coast of England: airship " <i>L.-34</i> " destroyed by aeroplane off Hartlepool and " <i>L.-21</i> " destroyed by aeroplane off Yarmouth.
28th November	First German daylight aeroplane raid on London (by single aeroplane).
29th November	Admiral Sir David Beatty appointed to succeed Admiral Sir John Jellicoe as Commander-in-Chief, Grand Fleet.
